The children enjoyed making marks on a handle for our Easter baskets. We sang the songs The Grand Old Duke of York as we made zigzags up and down; Round and Round the Garden as we drew curly whirly shapes and Hickory Dickory Dock as we drew straight lines. We flicked paint onto an oval shape which we will make into an Easter card next week. All the children watered the sunflower seeds and were amazed as they saw them begin to grow. We have been reinforcing the sounds from previous weeks: m,a,s,d,t,i,n and p. Our sound that we have focused on this week is 'g', Girl: round her face, down her hair and give her a curl. The children all had a go at mark making, attempting to form the letters we have learned. The children have been writing their names as they enter Nursery. Clothing in Nursery

- * Please send your child to Nursery in either school uniform or old clothing. It is likely that your child will get messy during the Nursery session as we have access to pens, paint and the muddy/wet outdoor environment.
- * It is essential that the children have a spare change of clothes (including underwear) available in Nursery at all times. This can be stored in a clearly labelled bag on your child's coat peg. As we have access to our outdoor play environment during all weather conditions, we would like to ask that the children bring a coat or light jacket into Nursery every day. It is also beneficial if your child wears shoes and a coat that they find easy to take on and off.
- * It is **essential** that all clothing, is labelled with your child's full name (**especially coats, uniform, jumpers and shoes**). This will help us to ensure that any missing items of clothing are quickly returned to their correct owners.
