

Early Years Foundation Stage Weekly Newsletter Friday 11th March 2022 Nursery

This week the children have been learning about the Life Cycle of a Chicken and painted a picture showing the cycle. They learned the rhyme '5 eggs and 5 eggs that makes 10'. The children were amazed at the results as they used ink which floated on the water to make marbled effects on card. When dried, all the children made a fantastic attempt at cutting out an oval shape. Later this will be cut and assembled to make an Easter card.

Also this week, the children visited the KS1 hall. After warming up our muscles, the children practised throwing and catching a balloon with their partner.

To reinforce the importance of staying safe in our local environment the Road Safety Educational Team from St Helens came in to tell us a story. She was very impressed with how the Nursery children sat and listened and answered questions about what they had seen and heard in their environment.

We will be asking for volunteers to join us on our walk to St Mark's church on West End Road during this half term. Please see a member of staff if you are available to help on the walk.

As well as reinforcing the sounds from previous weeks, our sounds that we have focused on this week are 'o' - all around the orange and 'c' -curl around the caterpillar. The children looked for objects in and around Nursery that began with that letter in addition to finding out what we had hiding in our sound bag.

Next week's sound is 'k'.

We have continued to enjoy 'Jolly Songs', which are phonic based songs to help the children recognise letter sounds.
