


# Early Years Foundation Stage Weekly Newsletter Friday 26th March 2021

To make our Easter cards children cut the painted eggs they made last week and assembled them onto card with a little chick. We used split pins to attach the top of the egg and the little chick peeps out. All the children watered the sunflower seeds and were amazed as they saw them begin to grow.

We have been reinforcing the sounds from previous weeks: m,a,s,d,t,i,n, p and g. The sounds that we have focused on this week are: 'o': all around the orange and 'c': curl around the caterpillar. Children are really good at listening to instructions and are attempting to form the letters we have learned. The children have been writing their names as they enter Nursery. It would be very helpful if you could encourage your child to practise writing their name at home. The children are still enjoying role playing The Three Little Pigs, pretending to be the wolf or a pig. They chase each other around the Nursery garden to the different 'houses'. Inside they build with straw, sticks or bricks.

Next week we will be sending home their sunflowers for you to care for at home.

Could you please continue to help your child to practise fastening their own zips on their coat. Next week's sounds is 'k': down the kangaroo's body, tail and leg. This is a tricky letter to write.



#### <u>\*Clothing in Nursery\*</u> \* Please send your child to Nursery in either school uniform or old clothing. It is likely that your child will get messy during the Nursery session as we have access to pens, paint and the muddy/wet outdoor environment. \* It is essential that the children have a spare change of clothes (including underwear) available in Nursery at all times. This can be stored in a clearly labelled bag on your child's coat peg. As we have access to our outdoor play environment during all weather conditions, we would like to ask that the children bring a coat or light jacket into Nursery every day. It is also beneficial if your child wears shoes and a coat that they find easy to take on and off. \* It is essential that all clothing, is labelled with your child's full name (especially coats, uniform, jumpers and shoes). This will help us to ensure that any missing items of clothing are quickly returned to their correct owners. **\*\*IMPORTANT NOTICES\*\* Bicycles and Scooters** Please be aware that if you travel to school on a scooter or bicycle then it is in the interest of public Legh Vale School is a non-smoking site.
