Over the last two weeks in Nursery the children have celebrated the Coronation of King Charles the Third by having a party, making crowns and colouring flags. It was lovely to see all the children dressed in red, white and blue. We reinforced our learning of 2D shapes and found different shapes in the environment, indoors and outdoors. We have discussed 3D shapes using mathematical vocabulary.

After reading the Three Little Pigs the children role-played the story in the garden and with each other in small groups. Each child told their Key Worker the story and drew a picture of the characters. We discussed various objects in the setting then sorted them into different material groups, wood, sticks, straw and bricks.

In the garden we continued to enjoy developing our physical skills of balancing, as well as aiming and throwing.
